

Seventeenth-century Antwerp was a city of great artistic wealth. From the beginning of the 16th century, Antwerp took over from Bruges as the major shipping hub of the Low Countries, and with that, it attracted wealth and goods from around the world. With the iconoclastic riots (1566), followed by the Eighty Years' War (1568-1648), this prosperity began to fade. As part of the iconoclasm as a result of these events, following the Treaty of Münster in 1648, Antwerp was in need of reinventing its artistic traditions. This marked the beginning of the Flemish Baroque movement, with its centre being Antwerp. It is near the end of this period that Balthasar van den Bossche (1681-1715) features. Van den Bossche's work is typical of this school: he is best known for his depictions of wealthy individuals with their collections, or representations of their military power.



The present work depicts the spoils of war, including a chamfron, an Ottoman-style quiver, a military banner, and also references to travel and expedition such as the globe, a parasol, and what is probably a statue of Mercury – a representation of both travel and commerce. It is therefore likely that this painting was commissioned for a wealthy individual with connections to the military and exploration. It is possible that the commissioner is the woman depicted on the throne, with a male relative or husband depicted in the portrait within the scene. These scenes from antiquity rose in popularity during the later baroque period, but especially in the neoclassical that followed, and allude to the ancient authority of power. Van den Bossche's works often depicted an opulent interior or - as in the present work - a half room, half landscape composition, repeating the same motifs, often crowded with objects including flags, paintings, globes and armour. £2,500-3,500
