# Gold coins hoard found under a kitchen floor

by Laura Chesters

A family re-laying a kitchen floor in their home in Ellerby, North Yorkshire, discovered 264 gold coins stored in a small mug.

The cache dating from the reign of James I to George I

was found in the soft-drinks can-sized earthenware container no more than 8in (20cm) beneath the floor of the 18th century house.

The family made the discovery in the summer of 2019 and the group, now

known as the Ellerby Hoard, will be offered as individual lots at auction by Spink on October 7 with an estimate of more than £260,000.

Among the hoard is a contemporary, 1721, 4000-Reis, struck during the reign of Jõaõ V of Portugal (permissible in England at the time and known as 'moidore' – a phonetic corruption of the Portuguese for a piece of gold, moi d'ore).

Specialist Gregory Edmund at Spink said: "The contextualised discovery of [the moidore] coin is exceedingly rare for England, with only the Merton College Chapel trove of 1903 presenting a comparable profile."

This coin is sought for accession by the British Museum due to its extreme rarity in a British hoard context.

However, the remainder of the coins are not deemed Treasure.

Edmund said: "A coroner adjudicated that the cache of coins should be disclaimed because they were less than 300 years old at point of deposition, and because an original owner could be identified."

Spink said the original owners of the coins were the

wealthy merchant Fernley-Maister families of Hull. The hoard was probably amassed during the lifetime of Joseph Fernley and his second wife Sarah, daughter of Alderman Henry Maister. Sarah stayed in Ellerby until her death in 1745, after which time the family estates passed through non-direct channels to nephews and nieces until the line died out.

Edmund added: "It is extraordinarily rare for hoards of English gold coins to ever come onto the marketplace. The number of coins and method of burial presents an extraordinary opportunity to appreciate the complicated English economy in the first decades of the Bank of England.

"Why they never recovered the coins when they were really easy to find just beneath original 18th century floorboards is an even bigger mystery."

# Warrior figure stolen from former antiques shop

The art and antiques trade has been asked to help track down a stolen wooden sculpture from a renowned former antiques shop in Hampshire.

Retired dealer Alfred Fleming fears it now may be in Ireland or mainland Europe but hopes there is a chance it can be recovered.

The 6ft high teak statue of a warrior is one of a pair, representing mythical figures Gog and Magog, that were on plinths either side of the front door of the well-known Clock Tower building in Southsea.

Fleming and his family operated an antiques dealership from the building for 70 years.

He sold the shop to current occupier Tony Wood in 2005 and moved to the basement, where he traded until 2015 when he retired.

Wood runs his hairdressing



salon from the Edwardian building and when he took over the property he renovated the premises and had the figures

restored to their original teak

finish. The figures were moved

inside the shop but, as the building is listed, planning experts said the figures should be returned to the entrance.

They were secured within iron grills and CCTV fitted but at 2am on June 10 one of the sculptures was stolen.

# **Carved locally**

The Clock Tower building on Castle Road was constructed in 1903/4 and it is believed the figures were carved by local ship figurehead craftsmen working at nearby dockyards.

The Fleming antiques business can be traced back to 1908 when Alfred's grandfather operated from a number of locations including London and Southsea. In 1942 the family's premises opposite The Clock Tower were bombed and the business moved to The Clock Tower.

Alfred's uncle Jack, who had run the business since the Second World War, retired in 1994 and Alfred continued the firm with his wife Christel until 2015. He said: "Although I sold the building in 2005 I am still very attached to it and I really hope we can recover the missing figure."

# Badges symbolise soldiers' esteem for nurse Esme

Robinson (**right**) was based at Churchill Hospital, Headington, Oxford, from 1942-45. The cape, consigned by her daughter, sold for £4500 (plus 25% buyer's premium) at Sworders of Stansted Mountfitchet, Essex, on August 30, against an estimate of £800-1200. Proceeds went to the British Legion.

Previewed in ATG No 2555, it was purchased by a private buyer located in Suffolk who was bidding online. The underbidder, also private, was also taking part via the internet.

The scarlet lining is decorated with 201 cloth

formation signs and shoulder titles. At formal events (such as the annual VAD carol concert) Robinson was asked to wear her cape navy side up as the display of so many regimental badges was frowned on by her superiors

It was during one of the concerts in Wheatley, Oxfordshire, that she met her future husband.

The cape was offered together with memorabilia including Robinson's Soldier's

Service and Pay Book, Certificate of Enrolment, a VAD cloth badge and a Needlecraft for HM Forces kit.

# Ready for a night of surreal dreams

This striking unique bed was designed in 1935 by poet and patron Edward James together with interior decorator Norris Wakefield.

Measuring 3ft 4in high x 5ft 3in wide x 10ft 8in long (1.01 x 1.6 x 3.26m), it was produced for the Map Room of Monkton House on the West Dean Estate, West Sussex, which James inherited along with a substantial family fortune in 1935.

Art collector and poet James (1907-84) collaborated with Salvador Dalí, architect Christopher Nicholson, his associate Hugh Casson and Wakefield to transform the Lutyens-designed Arts & Crafts hunting lodge dating from 1902 into a three-dimensional ideal of

Surrealism during the 1930s.

Roseberys, the south London saleroom offering the bed with an estimate of £20,000-40,000 on September 14, says: "The project marked an exploration of realising Surrealism as a lived experience which pervaded everyday objects and spaces.

"It was this redesign of Monkton House that bore Surrealist masterpieces such as Dalí's *Mae West Lips Sofa* and his famous *Lobster Telephone.*"

The bed, illustrated in Nicola Coleby's *A Surreal Life: Edward James 1907-1984*, was bought by the present owner at Christie's, London, as part of The Edward James Collection in June 1986.

# Paul Allen collection tipped to set highest auction total

An unprecedented collection of art belonging to the late Paul Allen, co-founder of Microsoft, could break records as it goes under the hammer at Christie's in New York this autumn.

Representing 500 years of art history and valued at more than \$lbn, Visionary: The Paul G Allen Collection takes place in November at Christie's New York. All proceeds will be dedicated to philanthropic causes.

So far only two works have been released as highlights of the sale. The first is one of Cézanne's depictions of *La montagne Sainte-Victoire* painted between 1888-90, which has an estimate in

excess of \$100m. The other is Jasper Johns' *Small False Start* (1960), estimated to make over \$50m.

Allen is also known to have owned works by Claude Monet, Gustav Klimt, David Hockney and Jan Brueghel the Younger.

If the sale reaches the \$lbn mark, it will beat the record auction total for a single-owner sale which is currently held by Sotheby's.

It achieved a total of \$922m for the collection of Linda and Harry Macklowe sold in two parts, last November and May this year.





# **Belting result for Action Man**

A lot offering Action Man outfits and accessories from the flock hair period c.1970 sold for 10 times the low estimate at a Devon saleroom thanks to a considerable rarity it contained.

The Judo Set number 34805 is a 'Holy Grail' for collectors of the British toy range, and a boxed version with Judogi suit and trousers, grading belts and booklet was the reason for the £5000 result via thesaleroom.com at Auction Antiques (25% buyer's premium) on August 25, way above a £50-80 estimate.

It was sold with two sets of 35212 Underwater Explorer Skin Diver, two of 35207 Explorer High Altitude, and 35206 Explorer Mountaineer Anorak and 35201 Explorer Polar Accessories and loose shoes, hat, trousers and satchel, all described as having 'aged packaging, fair to good condition'.

However, the judo gear was key. Action Man was launched by Palitoy in the UK in 1966, copying the success of GI Joe in the US introduced in 1964. The judo set was among the first flock-haired releases in 1970, as listed in the equipment manual, and seemingly produced just for a year before a later

re-release much less valued by collectors. Flock hair replaced the painted hair of the original figures (see actionmanhq.co.uk for more details).

It was part of the Action Man sports range which is now much rarer than the military themed figures, not selling so well at the time and probably ordered less by toy retailers as a result.

Clive Downham of Auction Antiques in Hele, Exeter, said: "The lot went to a private collector based in Scotland. The gentleman was hugely excited to add this very rare piece to his collection.

"The vendor is Devon based. They were delighted that this 'drawer find' made such an excellent price."

When another Action Man judo set was sold for £5400 (estimate £4000-6000) at Teesside toy auction house Vectis in May 2015 a BBC report suggested it was "believed to be one of only two in such pristine condition"

That one came from the collection of 88-year-old Doug Carpenter, a former salesman for Palitoy who had kept scores of boxes in his loft for decades.

In October 2020, also in Devon, a group of seven boxed uniform/accessories sets plus seven Action Man equipment packs, estimated at £50-80, made £5500 at Atkins Auctions in Axminster.

# First Beano takes £15,000 at auction

A copy of *The Beano* No 1 – which went on to become the world's longest-running comic weekly – sold for £15,000 at Comic Book Auctions in a timed online sale ending on August 28.

While it did not quite hit the heights of the record for this first issue, it was only £200 below the sum paid by a Scottish collector in September 2015 also at London firm CBA.

The Beano Comic No 1 is a trophy item for most UK comics collectors. Priced at 2d, it came out on July 30, 1938. The comic was an immediate success, selling roughly 443,000 copies.

With only around 30 copies

known to exist, the example on offer at CBA had bright cover colours and some minor tears to right-hand page edges and one tear to the spine. The vendor had it in his collection for some 40 years. On an estimate of £2800-3500, it was hotly contested, taking 92 bids in total to reach the hammer price (plus 19% buyer's premium). The buyer was an English ex-pat living in the

The £15,200 record example was offered with the four-page promotional flyer that was issued with No 1 and No 2 and slipped inside copies of *Hotspur*, *Adventure*, *Rover*, *Skipper* and *Wizard*.

# Smith takes role at Mellors & Kirk

Mellors & Kirk has appointed Daniel Smith as the specialist in charge of its rare books



department. Smith was previously at Bamfords, where he worked for the past nine years, during which time he established specialist book

Mellors & Kirk was founded by owner Nigel Kirk and Nicholas Mellors in Nottingham in 1993.

The firm also operates from a consignment and valuation office in Bridgnorth, Shropshire.

# GB Antiques owner Blackburn dies

Allan Blackburn, the founder and owner of GB Antiques at Lancaster Leisure Park, has died aged 75.

Born in Clitheroe in 1947, the great-nephew of television pioneer John Logie Baird, he followed his grandfather into antiques dealing.

The business he created (named GB after his wife Gloria Blackburn) is based on the old Hornsea Pottery site on Wyresdale Road in Lancaster. It achieved fame in 2003 when an escaped bull went on the rampage inside the centre.

Two of his three children, Jimmy and Dawn, followed their father into the family business.

# Stanley Gibbons Group goes private

Stanley Gibbons Group, the stamps and coins dealership and auction firm, has got the green light from shareholders to go private.

It announced its plans in July but needed the support of shareholders. The major shareholder, Phoenix Asset Management, which now owns more than 78% of the group, provides all its debt facilities. It said there are "clear benefits" to going private.

It will now remove its listing from the Alternative Investment Market (AIM) – a junior sub-market of the London Stock Exchange – on September 7 and Phoenix will continue to buy up shares at 1.5p a share.

# Baseball card sets sports record sum

A baseball card has become the most expensive item of sports memorabilia ever sold at auction.

The SGC Mint+ 9.5 1952 Topps Mickey Mantle rookie card, regarded as one of just a handful of the player in nearperfect condition, took \$10.5 m/£9.03 m (or \$12.6m/£10.84m including buyer's premium) from an anonymous US buyer at Heritage Auctions of Dallas on August 27-28.

Mantle played for the New York Yankees in the 1950s-60s.

The result beat Diego Maradona's 1986 World Cup 'Hand of God' shirt sold for £6m (£7.14m with premium) at Sotheby's this May.

This Mantle No 311 card was originally unearthed by Al Rosen, also known as 'Mr Mint'. Heritage said: "His father, he maintained, had been a delivery driver for the botched distribution of Topps' 1952 issue and a case of unused product had been sitting in the basement for over 30 years."

That was in 1985, and Rosen

sold the 'Rosen Find' almost instantly, with this Mantle No 311 card changing hands for \$1000. Rosen then bought it back six years later in 1991 for \$40,000, and quickly 'flipped' it again, selling at \$50,000 to Anthony Girodano, a New Jersey waste management entrepreneur, the vendor here.

# Early Thailand revealed in a £12,000 album

A group of photographs, letters, documents and objects relating to early 20th century Thailand appeared in a timed online sale at Winchester saleroom Rushbrooks.

It was consigned by descendants of Walter Ralph Durie Beckett, a British diplomat who served in Siam (as the country was then called) from 1886 and spent his whole career there. Rising to become first secretary in the diplomatic service in Bangkok in 1904, Beckett acted as Chargé d'Affaires on several occasions and for a short period was in charge of the legation.

Offered as nine separate lots in the auction that closed on August 19, the collection drew bidders from UK and overseas and raised a hammer total of £19,875 with all of the lots selling.

The highlight was a photograph album from 1905 containing 72 black and white images relating to an important ritual: the Sokan Ceremony where a young royal would have their top-knot cut.

Given to Beckett as a keepsake from Siam's King Chulalongkorn (Rama V), it included photographs of the Siamese royal family, including the king and queen themselves, as well as views of the ceremony taking place and shots of royal palaces and residences.

All the photographs were neatly listed in a typed 'Explanatory Note' and the album's pages were decorated with scrollwork pencil drawings by an unknown hand.

With the estimate set at £1200, the album was subject to 68 separate bids from seven different parties before it sold at £12,000 (plus 22.5% buyer's premium including VAT) to an overseas-based buyer.



# Hammer 1100 CS

Edinburgh auction highlights work of the Highlands silversmiths who operated far from the control of the assay office in the Scottish capital, as *Roland Arkell* reports

More than a century of scholarship has helped bring back to life the era of the Highlands 'hammermen': the 17th, 18th and 19th century Scottish silversmiths who, for reasons of distance and duty, chose to operate beyond the control of the assay office in Edinburgh.

From Aberdeen to Wick, there were at least 30 different Scottish centres of silver production making domestic and ecclesiastic wares with an extraordinary array of town and makers' marks that first piqued the interest of silver connoisseurship in the Victorian age.

The market for Scottish provincial silver has since made big names of what were once relatively small concerns.

Hugh Ross of Tain, the maker of a small series of thistle cups that have long been icons of the collecting field, is among them.

The Ross mark was once the source of some confusion although it is now understood that the initials HR conjoined represent at least three different men working in the sparsely populated royal burgh across perhaps 90 years: Hugh Ross I (c.1680-1732); Hugh Ross II (c.1715-70) and Hugh Ross III (c.1745-87) were father, son and grandson.

#### Rare Ross I spoon

A Tain masking or mote spoon by Hugh Ross I was among the highlights of the 90 lots of Scottish provincial silver offered on August 17 at Lyon & Turnbull's (26% buyer's premium) Scottish Works of Art sale timed to coincide with the return of the *Edinburgh Festival*.

Formed with an urn finial, a section of scroll work and a pierced bowl, this rare spoon seems to fit somewhere between the traditional Scottish masking or mashing spoon (used for stirring the tea in the pot) and the pierced English mote spoon (used to strain the floating leaves from the cup and clear blockages in the strainer or spout).

Just three of these Ross spoons are known, with the last example on the market (sold for £1900 at L&T in February 2008) now part of the

Lottery-funded silver collection at Tain & District Museum. The present example, estimated at £1500-2500, sold for £3100.

Although not such a well-recorded maker, the small body of surviving work by John Baillie of Inverness is universally of a very high standard. He is considered the most accomplished silversmith in the town in the mid-18th century and on a par with many of his Edinburgh contemporaries. Quaichs appear to have been a mainstay of his work but so too were mugs (two pairs are recorded) and hot milk jugs (two are known).

The pair of 10oz salvers offered at L&T are the only recorded in Inverness silver and one of only a very small handful of Scottish provincial pairs extant. They are marked *IB* and *INS* plus the letter *X*. They were last sold at Phillips in 1988 (the first dedicated sales of Scottish silver emerged in the 1980s) and have since resided in a private Scottish collection. At L&T they sold for £5500.

### **Pricey optional extra**

A particularly rare form in Scottish provincial silver is the tea tray – very much the pricey optional extra whenever a tea set was commissioned.

Only a handful of provincial examples are known (teapot stands, waiters and salvers are much more common) and it seems likely they would have graced only the wealthiest and most fashionable families and houses of Scotland.

The example offered here, of circular scalloped outline with scrolling hoof feet, weighs 35oz and carries marks for the Glasgow firm Milne & Campbell (in partnership between 1757-80). At the time the settlement on the Clyde was yet to grow fat on sugar and tobacco from the Americas and supported only a handful of silversmiths. It was not until 1819 that the city had an official assay office.

This tray is engraved to the reverse with the names and dates of William Crawford and Elizabeth Gow, a Glasgow couple who were



married in 1731. It may have been made following Elizabeth's death in 1787. It sold at the lower end of the £3000-5000 estimate.

Also by Milne & Campbell was a rococo oil and vinegar cruet frame that retained twin cut glass bottles with simple pull-off covers. Although a scarce form in Scottish provincial silver, a similar example by Adam Graham of Glasgow sold in the equivalent sale last year for £2600. This one made a more modest £1500.

#### **Market tests**

The market is tested with this much material only once, maybe twice, a year and, in a relatively small field, prices can rise and fall depending on collecting preferences.

An uncomfortably high unsold rate of over 40% is reflective of a market that, at this moment at least, is struggling to sustain prices at the top end and in need of entry-level buyers further down the price scale.

The unsolds here included almost all of the Perth silver lots (nine of the 10 were bought in) plus possibly the only piece of Arbroath holloware outside a museum (a snuff box by Andrew Davidson estimated at £4000-6000) and a rare wine funnel and stand by John Keith of Banff guided at £5000-8000. It had last sold at L&T in 2013 for £5600 (£7000 including premium).

# Fill a kettle modelled as a curling stone

Nineteenth and early 20th century novelty silver continues to be one of the strengths of the collecting category.

Among the Scottish-themed but English-made lots in the Lyon & Turnbull sale was a late Victorian presentation kettle-onstand by Walker & Hall, Sheffield, 1899.

Generally this is not the most commercial of forms, but this example was modelled as a curling stone with the legs formed as two crossed brushes and engraved with winners of *The Gordon Trophy Presented by Mr & Mrs Gordon for Annual Competition*. Weighing 27oz, it doubled hopes, selling for £2200.

Looking ahead, L&T's general silver sale in Edinburgh on September 13 includes another fine Victorian novelty: one of the most desirable of all antique mustard pots.

Modelled as a chimpanzee wearing an Oriental jacket smoking a pipe and spectacles, the hinged cover is formed as a hat with the spoon providing the plume. Made by Richards & Brown, London 1867, it is engraved to the underside with the initials *WBE* and a Victorian registration mark for February 26, 1842.

Estimate £5000-8000.

Brontë family link boosts jug result

Tennants' (20% buyer's premium) silver sale on July 16 included a Victorian jug by Robert Hennell with Brontë family connections.

One side of this unusual 36oz piece was chased with a depiction of Sir Edwin Landseer's medieval tableau *Bolton Abbey in the Olden Times* (the original hangs at Chatsworth). The other has a presentation inscription dated 1873 from Viscountess Montauban, daughter of the Haworth mill owner Richard Shackleton Butterfield, to his doctor Amos Ingham.

Both Ingham and Butterfield were known to the Brontë family. Patrick Brontë, father of Charlotte, had successfully lobbied for better treatment of the workers at Butterfield's factory. After a report demanded improvements, Charlotte noted in a letter to her father saying "...I cannot help enjoying Mr Butterfield's defeat – and yet in one sense this a bad state of things – calculated to make working people both discontented and insubordinate."

Ingham was the local surgeon who saw to Charlotte in February and March 1855 during her last illness and signed her death certificate. A portrait of him is in the Brontë Parsonage Museum.

A fine piece of Victorian silver with a story

to tell, it made £3000 (estimate £700-1000).

#### Anchor weighed up

The same sum was bid online, this time at the lower end of expectations, for a Victorian Admiralty pattern silver table service weighing a total of 112oz.

The rare pattern, depicting a fouled anchor below the royal crown and within scrolls, was first made for use of Royal Navy officers in the early 19th century, with the earliest known extant pieces being hallmarked for 1838.

As this harlequin service shows (it includes pieces by John Samuel Hunt, Francis Higgins, George Adams, John Samuel Hunt, Hunt and Roskell, John Edward Bingham and William Theobalds dating from 1840-77), it was produced by various makers throughout the 19th century although it was discontinued around the time of the First World War.


Admiralty pattern flatware is still in use in RN messes today.

The service at Tennants, with most pieces engraved with the crest of Allsopp and the British Government broad arrow, had been a gift from the RN to Rear-Admiral Hugh Webb Faulkner (1900-69) and came by descent.

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# Famous owners Tuke and Klimt enhance early 20th century items

This textbook Edwardian Arts & Crafts planished silver chalice by Omar Ramsden and fellow Sheffield-born designer Alwyn Carr, pictured **below left**, is of extra interest for its inscription.

As well as the legend to the base Ramsden et Carr Me Fecerunt it is engraved to the rim I was wrought for Henry S Tuke in the year 1905.

This connection with one of the greats of the Newlyn School and English Impressionism broadened its appeal when offered for sale at **Gorringe's (25% buyer's premium)** in Lewes on August 1. Estimated at £600-800, it took £1600.

Henry Scott Tuke's extensively penned diary from March 1899 to December 1905 survives in the Tate and is available to search online. It might just be possible that somewhere among its 196 pages this chalice is mentioned.

#### **Exhibited several times**

Another expression of cutting-edge taste from the first decade of the 20th century was offered by Woolley & Wallis (25% buyer's premium) as part of a Silver & Vertu sale on July 12-13.


This Austrian silver and ivory covered box also had a famous former owner: it was once part of the estate of one Gustav Klimt.

Standing just under 6in (15cm) high from ivory finial to ball feet (it was sold with a non-transferable de minimis exemption), it was designed by Otto Prutscher and made at the Wiener Werkstätte by Alfred Mayer in 1908.

Exhibited on several occasions since the turn of the 21st century, it had previously sold at Sotheby's as part of the Torsten Brohan collection in March 2005 and came for sale from a private collection.

Guided at £10,000-15,000, it took £16,000 at W&W.







# Qing trophy won by an Australian bidder

Cheffins' (24.5% buyer's premium) silver offering in Cambridge on August 4 was topped by a Qing trophy, c.1850. Estimated at £1000-2000, it took £12,000 online from an Australian private buyer.

Along with pseudo-British marks, it has the mark of Khe Cheong, a Canton maker and retailer that operated from Old China Street and Club Street, Honam Island, between c.1840-90.

The firm produced many similar standing cups that (although today described as Chinese export or China trade silver) were made for the domestic market, often purchased as trophies for the Western sporting clubs that grew up in Hong Kong and Shanghai. The earliest Hong Kong horse racing trophy, the 1846 'Hunters Plate' trophy, has similar marks for Khe Cheong.

This 10in (26cm) example, of a similar date, has two scroll bamboo style handles and is decorated to the body with repoussé, chased and engraved battle scenes, foliage and buildings under an applied vacant shield shaped cartouche.

Back in January this year at Lawrences, The Celestial Cup, a Chinese silver trophy, c.1850, marked for Khecheong of Canton, sold for £26,000 to specialist dealer S&J Stodel of the London Silver Vault. Passed by descent in a Somerset family, it was shown at the *Great Exhibition* the year after it was the prize in a Hong Kong horse race





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
The sale at Swan Fine Art (21% buyer's premium) in Tetsworth, Oxfordshire, on August 11-12 included two Irish 'freedom' boxes, c.1775. Estimated at just £100-200 each, they were bid to much higher sums.

Both were presented to the Honourable Sir John Blanquiere K.B. Principal Secretary to his Excellency Earl Harcourt Lord Lieutenant General Governor of Ireland. Later raised to the peerage as Baron de Blaquiere of Ardkill following support for the Act of Union, he served as Chief Secretary for Ireland alongside Viceroy Simon Harcourt, 1st Earl Harcourt (1714-77), between 1772-76.

One unmarked box, engraved to the cover with the town crest of Belturbet and to the base with a presentation inscription, had been a gift from the Provost and Burgesses of Belturbet in Co Cavan.

It took £4000.

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# Pressure point in the saleroom

Barometers among collections of two renowned polymaths test the market temperature

A passion of polymath banker and art collector Sir Nicholas Goodison (1934–2021), barometers were predictably a major feature of the residue of his collection offered at Roseberys' (25% buyer's premium) south London sale.

Goodison, a major City figure in banking and a former chairman of the London Stock Exchange, was also renowned in the world of arts and antiques as a chairman of the Courtauld, president of the Furniture History Society and a published world authority on barometers.

The market in them has faded, partly down to fashion but also because of the 2007 EU laws banning trade in mercury.

Barometers over 50 years old escape the bar but the problems of supply and parts for repairs and restoration remain.

At the very top of the market substantial five-figure prices can be achieved, as was seen among those at Christie's £8m auction in May of the art and antiques from Goodison's Mayfair residence. However, of the 18 barometers offered in that sale only 11 were sold.

# New angle

Two of the dozen barometers among the 112 Goodison lots at the Roseberys rooms in West Norwood on July 20 were reoffers from King Street. This time they were keenly sought at much-reduced reserves.

They included one of the collecting field's most desirable forms: a brassmounted walnut angle barometer signed *Charles Orme of Ashby-de-la-Zouch* and dated 1736.

As Goodison noted in his standard reference work *English Barometers 1680-1860* (first published in 1969), Orme made his name making angle barometers in Leicestershire.

"Orme owes his eminence to his successful exploitation of the angle tube principle," wrote Goodison. "Several angle barometers signed by him survive and I have yet to see any other type bearing his signature."

Christie's sale in May had included a very rare Orme angle barometer with triple tubes from 1741 that allowed the rise and fall of the mercury to be recorded over 5ft instead of the customary length





Several angle barometers survive and I have yet to see any other type bearing his signature of stick barometer. It had sold for £9500. The example at Roseberys with a 'sign-post' form case was a more standard single tube example but is the earliest known of Orme's angle barometers. Unsold at £8000-12,000 in May, it got away in July at £4100 to a London bidder.

A c.1770 stick barometer, signed *Joseph Finney, Liverpool* – the maker who made the angle barometer now in the Science Museum – also sold to a London buyer. Housed in a brass-mounted 3ft 9in (1.14m) tall mahogany frame, it more than doubled the lower estimate at £3200. Acquired from Lewes dealer Anthony Woodburn in 2001, it had failed at £10,000-15,000 at Christie's.

Goodison owned several outstanding wheel barometers, including a masterwork by Georg Adams, c.1765, which was formerly in the Samuel Messer collection that took £25,000 at Christie's.

Sold here at £2800 was a late 18th century work signed to the 14in (35cm) silvered dial *C. Betally, London* for Christopher Betally, one of a number of fine Italian makers who brought their skills to Georgian Britain.

The 3ft 4in (1.04m) mahogany case carried the trade label of *J. Somalvico* & Co. Makers London 18 Charles St. Hatton Garden. It was guided at £1000-1500 and sold to a UK buyer.

#### Dealer's retirement

A second expert's consignment to the Roseberys sale was the contents of the Chislehurst shop owned by Michael Sim since 1983.

Another polymath with a love of barometers, Sim had been director of the Royal Society of Chemistry before becoming a dealer. He is now retiring.

Known for his expertise in Georgian furniture and artefacts, his special interest in the scientific aspects of restoration led his

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# Good thing they weren't thrown away

Mid-20th century designer material such as teak *Boomerang* chairs was in demand at **Ewbank's** (25% buyer's premium) sale at Woking on July 27.

Designed by the Danish architect-designer team Peter Hvidt (1916-86) and Orla Molgaard (1907-93) for France & Son, Denmark, the chairs stamped and labelled to the seat rails were originally purchased by the vendor's family.

They showed signs of age with the lacquered brass legs a little loose and the timbers faded but sold at a top-estimate £2000.

"Prices have fallen for some traditional furniture, but Mid-century modern, especially pieces by Scandinavian designers, remains a strong area of the market," said auctioneer Andrew Ewbank.

The four top examples at the Surrey sale were shared among specialist dealers from the south-west of England, the Home Counties and the Midlands.

Other popular Danish forms included an Ib Kofod-Larsen (1921-2003) rosewood sideboard, Model 66, for Faarup Mobelfabrik, at £1800, and a set of 10 Niels Moller teak and rush-seated dining chairs, model 75, at £1400.

reputation-making identification of a masterpiece by the great Turin cabinet-maker Pietro Piffitti (1701-77). The superb pier table, made in 1732-34 and restored 1860-70, is now in the V&A.

Among his 273-lot consignment to West Norwood was a brass aneroid barometer, inscribed to the silvered and engraved dial *L. Casella, Maker to the Admiralty & Ordnance, London.* 

Edinburgh-born Louis Pascal Casella (1812-97) was a partner of renowned 19th century London scientific apparatus maker Cesare Tagliabue, whose clients included Charles Darwin and Dr David Livingstone.

His barometer, resembling a 5in (13cm) pocket watch, was in a glazed and fitted mahogany case with an applied plaque reading *Felixstowe 2nd June 1884*. It doubled the lower estimate, selling to a UK

bidder at £1600.

#### Glaswegian worthies

Another Scot with a scientific turn to interest Sim was James Tassie (1735-99).

Sometime Glasgow stonemason turned art student turned inventor, Tassie made his name and fortune using his scientific brain to help discover an enamel hard enough and with a texture perfect for making paste jewellery.


After a slow start in London, business soared with aristocratic clients from Catherine the Great down commissioning more than 20,000 pieces.

Six years before his death he began a similarly successful line in highrelief white paste portrait medallions, either from life or from drawings of his subjects, casting them in wax and then producing them in enamel.

The 12 examples from the Sim consignment depicted Glaswegian worthies and sold at prices from around £300-750 each for a total of £6500.

Top-seller was a pair of portraits of a Glaswegian banker and landowner and his wife. Typical of Tassie's works, the 3in (7.5cm) high portraits in oval wooden frames were inscribed *Arch*.[ibald] *Grahame*, 1795, *Tassie F*[ecit], and *Jane Grahame*, 1796, *Tassie F*.

Pitched at £700-1000, the pair went to a Scottish bidder at £1300.

# Goldsmith gems come to market

# Notable examples of Victorian art sell in London as renowned collector downsizes

Once a mainstay of the Victorian art market, Isabel Goldsmith has been a passionate collector in this field for a long time.

Known to be a committed and informed buyer with a good eye, she has not only supported the sector with her acquisitions but also through donations to institutions such as the Watts Gallery in Surrey.

However, like some other important players in the market, she has now scaled back her purchasing and, indeed, has become more of a seller than a buyer in recent years.

With the market becoming more selective and many wealthy collectors now ploughing their money into other areas, dealers and supporters of the Victorian picture market often look back to the halcyon days when she, together with Christopher 'Kip' Forbes, Lord Lloyd Webber and John Schaeffer, formed a quartet of major buyers who helped revive the entire 19th century sector in the 1980s-90s.

The daughter of Sir James Goldsmith, the businessman, financier and founder of the shortlived Eurosceptic Referendum Party, she inherited a significant share of his £1.2bn estate on her father's death in 1997. Earlier she had also inherited a major fortune from her maternal grandfather, the Bolivian tin magnate Antenor Patiño (himself a major collector of French furniture, works of art and silver).

Buying from both dealers and auctions, Isabel Goldmsith formed one of the world's leading collections of works by the Pre-Raphaelites and their followers, as well as their earlier classical forebears and representatives of the wider European

symbolist tradition. Working with the influential British designer and antiques dealer Geoffrey Bennison, she turned her Victorian home in South Kensington into an eyecatching setting for the Pre-Raphaelites.

# **Video promotion**

Since 2005 Goldsmith has sold a number of works from her collection with Christie's (26/20/14.5% buyer's premium). Most recently the auction house offered a large group of her pictures for the first time in a dedicated online sale that closed on July 14

In a pre-sale promotional video on Christie's website, Goldsmith said that having moved from her house to a smaller apartment, it was the right time to sell the works.

With 86 Pre-Raphaelite and Symbolist works on offer at the auction, 68 lots sold (79%) for a £1.53m total including premium.

The sale might not have included some of her most significant works but the spread of material represented over 40 years of collecting and gave the opportunity to test the temperature of the broader sector.

Although a number of dealers felt the bidding was a bit flat in places and some prices on the low side, the best of the collection seemed to show values holding up better than might

When Isabel Goldsmith bought *The guarded flame* (**right**), a watercolour by **Henry Ryland** (**1856-1924**), at Sotheby's in 1979, she and the interior designer Geoffrey Bennison decided to use it as the starting point for revamping her South Kensington home.

"The beautiful velvet textile in background of this watercolour inspired us to create a setting for the Pre Raphaelites," she said.

Forty-three years later, the picture was among the 86 Pre-Raphaelite and Symbolist works from her esteemed collection on offer at Christie's in a dedicated online auction.

The 20¼x 12in (51 x 30cm) pencil, watercolour and bodycolour heightened with gum arabic was executed on paper that had then been laid on panel and housed in

a tabernacle frame. A depiction of a single figure with classical and religious motifs, as well as featuring detailed floral patterns to the background, *The guarded flame* was a vintage example containing the artist's most familiar themes

Ryland, who had trained at the South Kensington School of Art before going to Paris and studying at the Académie Julian, was heavily influenced by the Pre-Raphaelites and neo-Classicists such as Sir Lawrence Alma-Tadema (1836-1912) and Albert Moore (1841-93).

In attractive condition, this work overshot a £20,000-30,000 estimate and was knocked down at £50,000 to a UK private buyer, setting a record for Ryland at auction.

have been expected considering the difficult state of the market.

# De Morgan discovered

The top lot was a small work on paper by Fernand Khnopff (1858-1921), La Médusa endormie from c.1896 that made £280,000 against a £200,000-300,000 estimate. It was pictured in News Digest, ATG No 2554.

Goldsmith had purchased it at Christie's back in 1988 for a hammer price of £120,000 – approximately £270,000 in today's money adjusting for inflation.

Two works by Evelyn De Morgan (1855-1919) also both sold but met with contrasting reactions in terms of bidding. Their performance seemed to underline the selectivity present in the sector even for an artist who has been gaining prominence over the last decade both commercially and curatorially.

Goldsmith bought De Morgan's works long before the #MeToo movement gave greater focus to overlooked women artists. She discovered De Morgan in the early days of her collecting when she started out buying prints, frequenting London markets such as Bermondsey.

Edward Burne-Jones was her favourite artist so De Morgan, who was a friend and follower of the influential Victorian aesthetic painter, was a natural extension.

In the above-mentioned video, Goldsmith said she was attracted to De Morgan's "extraordinary colourful vision" and was "very inspired by the fact that she was a female artist".

As she graduated to buying paintings, she purchased *The* 

Search-Light in 1983, paying £11,880 including buyer's premium at Christie's. It was one of the artist's works borne out of the devastation of the First World War, but also containing a spiritual element about enduring hope. It was painted during the conflict and was originally shown at the Red Cross exhibition of 1916.

The painting shows an angel shining her bright search light on the devil. Goldsmith said: "The Search-Light is about good overcoming evil and I thought was good 'feng shui' for my home."

The 2ft lin x 3ft 8in (64cm x 1.12m) oil on canvas was estimated at £70,000-100,000, which proved a bit too much for one of the artist's late works, and it was knocked down at £60,000. Although selling under estimate, the price was above the 1983 level when adjusted for inflation.

The other work by De Morgan was also a striking painting that appeared in the same Red Cross exhibition. *The Field of the Slain* was even more overtly connected to the horrors of the war with dead bodies littering the muddy ground and an angel gathering up their souls.

The work was closely tied-in with De Morgan's Spiritualist beliefs. Spiritualism had arrived in Britain from the US in the middle of the 19th century and communicating with souls of the dead was a central tenet of its creed.

When the picture last appeared at auction at Sotheby's New York in 1987, it had been incorrectly identified as *The Angel of Death*, the title of two other works by the artist. Back then it had sold at \$9000

# Banting bleeds for his art

Among the works commanding decent interest at Christie's Isabel Goldsmith sale were handful of lots from the Modern British category. One of the most notable was Figure with Heart by John Banting (1902-72)

The 17 x 21in (43 x 53cm) oil on canvas by the early British Surrealist dated from 1930 and was painted

with the explicit intention of shocking the viewer – showing a bleeding heart from a deliberate cut the artist had made in the canvas.

The veined leaf behind the figure was a recurring motif in Banting's work during this period.

The striking subject and early date made it an attractive proposition against a £8000-12,000 estimate and it was bid to a final £22,000 – above the £19,000 it had fetched at the sale of the Peter Nahum collection at Christie's South Kensington in November 2006 but a lesser amount taking inflation into account.

(£5500). The picture's history and correct title was subsequently uncovered and Goldsmith had bought it from New York dealer Barry Friedman.

Here the 2ft x 19¼in (62 x 46cm) oil on canvas was estimated at £30,000-50,000 and, judged to be a more important work in the artist's canon, drew greater interest and sold at £70,000.

The price, which stands within the top 10 auction results for De Morgan (source: Artprice), was particularly strong given its smaller format and here again represented an improvement in value over the three decades even accounting for the current high levels of inflation – something that cannot be said for every picture in the Victorian market.

# **Rated by Ruskin**

Elsewhere in the Goldsmith sale, a painting of wild flowers at the corner of a cornfield by Martha Darley Mutrie (1824-85) attracted interest against a £30,000-50,000 pitch. Works by the artist seldom appear and this was a particularly admired example.

Along with her younger sister Annie Mutrie (1826-93), she studied under George Wallis at the Manchester School of Design and specialised in flower subjects. John Ruskin described Martha's pictures as "nearly as good as simple flower-painting can be". He was attracted to the rich colours and details to the petals which were exemplified by this picture.

The 2ft 8in x 2ft 1in (82 x 64cm) oil on canvas had set the highest price for the artist when Goldsmith bought it at Christie's in 1994 where it was knocked down at £22,000.

This time around it was estimated at £30,000-50,000 and sold on mid-estimate, breaking its own auction record. However, in this case, the £40,000 price represented a marginal decline in value over the 28-year intervening period.

When asked by *ATG* whether more works from the Goldsmith collection were due to be offered at a future date, a Christie's spokesperson said there was nothing more to come at present. However, while they would no doubt be extremely keen to sell more works on her behalf, both auctioneers and dealers know what the Victorian market really needs is another buyer like her.





# Langley ladies ponder a quiet life in Newlyn

Pictures of old women from the fishing community of Newlyn are among the most prevalent works by **Walter Langley** (1852-1922).

They appear at auction fairly often, but few come as fresh to the market as a recent example that emerged at **Mellors & Kirk (24% buyer's premium)** of Nottingham on July 12.

The Evening of Life, a 3ft 3in x 2ft 6in (1m x 75cm) oil on canvas, which was signed and dated '06, was offered from a deceased estate having long been kept

in the same family ownership.

As well as appearing in the artist's catalogue raisonné, it was also featured in the 1997 biography by his grandson Roger Langley titled *Walter Langley: Pioneer of the Newlyn Art Colony.* The sitter, shown in deep contemplation in her chair with a blanket strewn over her knees, was probably the widow of a local fisherman.

As well as its wistful subject, painterly composition, market freshness and good size, another

factor in its favour was its decent unlined condition with only a minor abrasion above the sitter's left shoulder.

When it comes to Langley, who specialised in watercolours, oil paintings are not necessarily guaranteed to fetch more than a work on paper on an equivalent scale.

Nevertheless, the guide of £5000-8000 ensured it attracted interest and it took £17,000 – a sum that, although not at the top of the tree commercially, was comfortably above average for either an oil or watercolour by the

artist at auction.

a much smaller Langley watercolour showing an old woman at a window appeared at **Martel Maides (20% buyer's premium)** in St Peter Port, Guernsey on July 5-8.

Measuring 9% x 5%in (25 x 15cm), the picture was signed and had retained good colours although it suffered from a few issues to the paper – the sheet being slightly cockled and some glue residue noticeable at the edges. It also had a brown spot to the woman's skirt probably from some old restoration.

Again the estimate here was relatively restrained and, pitched at £1200-1500, it drew bidding and sold at £2900.

# Landseer charms

A 19th century work bringing even greater competition at Martel Maides was a **Charles Landseer (1799-1879)** painting of an Eastern subject.


An Indian Snake Charmer, a 14% x 10% in (38 x 27cm) oil on panel was an unusual picture by the artist who specialised in historical and literary

With a typed label on the back stating From the artist's sale 1879, a number of bidders felt its quality shone through despite a dirty and discoloured varnish, some extensive wash repainting and further restoration visible under UV light.

Estimated at £300-400, it was taken to £7500.



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

# Nun's illuminating role in Italy

Sixteenth century manuscript was produced in a monastery in Florence

The top lot in an August 23 sale held by Sworders (25% buyer's **premium)** was the remarkable early work on swan markings that sold for £54,000 and starred on the front cover of ATG No 2557, but the auction in Stansted Mountfitchet held plenty of other attractions.

One of the older lots on offer was an illuminated manuscript dating from 1584. A Gradual, a response sung or recited in the Mass, it was described as having been written and illuminated by a nun at the Monastery of the Holy Cross in Florence.

As the accompanying illustration shows, illuminated letters were its principal appeal and there were some 800 of them in all. In a 16th or 17th century blind-stamped leather binding, the spine of which was a later replacement, it sold at £9000.

#### **Crofts collection**

Several of the lots being offered by Sworders came from the Peter & Pat Crofts Collection, among them a beautifully drawn and coloured pedigree roll of undeclared vintage that recorded members of the noble Everingham family from 1105 to 1548. It realised £6500.

Another of the those Crofts Collection lots, and again sold at £6500, was an 1813, second edition of John Gabriel Stedman's Narrative of a Five Years' Expedition against the Revolted Negroes of Surinam..., a work first published in 1796.

Illustrated with 81 hand-coloured plates and maps, 16 of which, the catalogue noted, were engraved by William Blake, it was in what was thought to be a fairly recent binding of half leather and marbled boards.

Bid to £26,000 was a first edition, first impression set of JRR Tolkien's Lords of the Rings trilogy of 1954-55. The dust jackets of the three volumes were a little dust soiled and there was a tear to the spine of one of them, but overall the lot was defined as one that offered a fine and unread set.

# **Rowling unmasked**

Previewed in ATG No 2555, a 2013 first edition of The Cuckoo's Calling, a work by JK Rowling that was initially issued under the name of Robert Galbraith, was sold at £1200.










The Sworders catalogue entry noted that only 250 copies were said to have been signed as such before the creator of the Harry Potter books was unmasked as the true author.

She had secretly published the crime novel under the guise of the male debut writer.

The fictitious author was supposed to have been a former plain-clothes Royal Military Police investigator who had left the armed forces in

2003 to work in the civilian security industry.


The Cuckoo's Calling, about a war veteran turned private investigator called Cormoran Strike, was reasonably well reviewed at the time but had sold fewer than 1500 copies before the secret was blown by The Sunday Times in July.

Within hours, it had risen more than 5000 places to top Amazon's sales list.


# Extensive collection of Ford Madox Ford emerges in Cheshire

A substantial collection of works by just one multi-talented and enormously influential figure was presented as part of series of sales held by Adam Partridge (20% buyer's premium) in its Macclesfield rooms from August 3-5.

Ford Madox Ford (1873-1939) – whose full name was Joseph Leopold Ford Hermann Madox Hueffer – was an English novelist, poet, critic and editor. His journals *The English Review* and *The Transatlantic Review* were highly influential in the development of early 20th-century English and US literature.

#### **Best sellers**

The most expensive of the many works of his on offer in this auction,



at £3000, was the tetralogy of 1924-28 that comprises *Parade's End*, *No More Parades*, *A Man Could Stand Up* and, appropriately enough, *Last Post* of 1928.

All retained their dust jackets and the first three were first edition copies, with *No More Parades* additionally inscribed by the author.

Another 1925 first of that last-mentioned work, inscribed by its author on the front free endpaper, "...The adjutant saying 'there will be no more Parades', and... There damn well wont &... No more hope; no more glory; no more parades for you & me anymore...", sold at £1700.

Lotted together and sold at £1800 were a 1900 first of *Poems* for *Pictures* inscribed for Mr & Mrs Martindale from "Their unworthy son in law The Author...", and a copy of *The Face of the Night* bearing an ink dedication to an unidentified recipient, one H Martindale.

One Madox Ford work that lacked any autograph additions but sold for a much higher than expected £720, on an estimate of just £50-80, was a 1923 first in dust jacket of *The Marsden Case*.

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

# Book recalls evolution of a natural selection theory



Above: the title-page of Patrick Matthew's On Naval Timber and Arboriculture of 1831 sold by McTear's for £1300. Sold online to a collector in France in an August 10 sale held by **McTear's (24% buyer's premium)** of Glasgow was a scarce copy in original boards of *On Naval Timber and Arboriculture*.

The 1831 work by Scottish grain merchant, fruit farmer, landowner and naturalist Patrick Matthew (1790-1824) took £1300

The work's significance and appeal lies in an appendix note that appears to anticipate Darwin's theory of natural selection by almost 30 years, and even uses the expression "natural process of selection".

That it did so was acknowledged by Darwin in the third and subsequent editions of his *Origin of Species*, where he noted that Matthew "...gives precisely the same view on the origin of species as that ... propounded by Mr. Wallace and myself".

Though Matthew offers no scientific evidence for his view in this work, said the cataloguer, he did at one stage have cards printed up identifying himself as "the discoverer of natural selection".


# Four Quartets and a signature add up to £1750

A small collection of the works of TS Eliot offered in a **Canterbury Auction Galleries (22.5% buyer's premium)** sale of August 6-7 included what appears to have been a 1943, first US printing of his *Four Quartets*.

It was not noted at the time whether this copy of that Harcourt Brace & Co edition bore the key identifying line 'First American Edition' to verso of the title-page, but it was certainly signed by Eliot and it sold online at £1750.

Other Eliot lots included a signed copy of No 1 of the 600 copies of *Ash Wednesday* printed by the Kirwan Press in 1930, but it failed to sell.

# How to illustrate the tale of a tail

Bid to £65,000 in a **Sotheby's (25/20/13.9% buyer's premium)** sale that ran online from July 12-19 was the ink drawing by Ernest Shephard shown **below**.

Doubly and faintly captioned in pencil 'Winnie the Pooh finds a tail' and 'Christopher Robin had nailed it on', the drawing is also signed with the illustrator's full initials, EHS, in the lower right corner.


It is an illustration that features in the chapter of AA Milne's *Winnie-the-Pooh* of 1926 that is titled 'In which Eeyore loses a tail and Pooh finds one', as were a now framed set of four small drawings by Shepard also on offer that show Eeyore looking anxiously around, behind and under his body from all possible angles for that missing tail.

But it all ended well, for as fans will know, "...when Christopher Robin had nailed it on in its right place again, Eeyore frisked about the forest...".

That set of drawings was sold at £55,000 by Sotheby's.

# The pathway to Impressionism

London exhibition outlines how French photographers started to cover a changing world

by Frances Allitt

At the heart of dealer **James Hyman**'s next show is a 19th century photograph of an artist working beneath a tree.

Taken in c.1849 by the French pioneering photographer Gustave le Gray (1820-84), the image reflects two fundamental shifts in art during that era: the rise of photography as an artistic medium and the move to capture landscapes en plein air, central to the Impressionist movement.

Hyman's London exhibition *Paths to Impressionism: Photography and the French Landscape 1850-1865* is a study in how one of these artistic revolutions shaped the other. Running in the Maddox Street gallery from September 6-10, it includes around 50 works, primarily photographs and paintings.

As well as tracking the relationship between photography and the larger art world, it examines how the French landscape was transformed in the age of industry. Artists captured that transition.

The show is sourced from the gallery's inventory, built over nearly 20 years from private collections, international dealers and auctions.

# **Repeating motifs**

Lending visual continuity to the show are repeating motifs, such as the tree (as seen in the le Gray photo) and pathways, whether roads, railways or rivers, including Edouard Baldus' view of Tarascon viaduct.

Often these photographs anticipate or reflect paintings. Baldus photographed the railways that inspired Claude Monet's paintings. Au bas du point de vue du camp by Eugène Cuvelier bears a strong resemblance to a drawing by Théodore Rousseau, Route en Forêt. Both date to c.1860.

Hyman tells ATG: "At the beginning of the 19th century the influence of Nicolas Poussin and Claude Lorrain is strongly felt in the way that the landscape is a setting for mythological, arcadian scenes and later in the century the Impressionists invented a new vision of the modern landscape. But between these moments, just before Impressionism, mid-century French photographers were beginning to

engage more and more with the modern landscape and to break with the convention of earlier tropes."

One dominant figure in this field is André Giroux (1801-79). He spent much of his life as a painter but briefly took up photograph. He is an ideal figure for the show representing

an intersection of the two practices. According to Hyman, he "did all that he could to bring together the two media through, for example, painting in fake clouds".

Among Giroux's 60 recorded early photographs taken mostly between 1853-55 are those enhanced with watercolours or gouache, including an example in the show which pairs a salt print from a paper negative with a matching overpainted print (*La Ferme au Pigeonnier*, c.1855).

Giroux is both highly collectable and still very affordable, Hyman says (although his rarest photographs can reach to around £50,000).

Other artists in the show include

Alphonse Delaunay, Charles Negre and Jean-Jacques Heilmann.

Hyman adds: "It includes some of the greatest works in the history of the medium but because the commercial focus at present is on contemporary photography, the greatest works of the 19th century remain undervalued."

The firm occupies two galleries on Maddox Street and a complementary exhibition of Modern British paintings and drawings, also featuring landscape and nature-related works, runs alongside the photography show. Later this month the dealership stands at the *British Art Fair* at Saatchi Gallery.

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# The web shop window

Though William and his friends never age, author Richmal Crompton kept the books upto-date with current concerns. Titles include William the Gangster (1934), William and Air Raid Precautions (1939) and William and the Moon Rocket (1954).

A copy of ... Moon Rocket is among the online offerings at **Country House Library**, priced at precisely £97.02. The 1954 hard cover is catalogued as being in good condition and is available for free UK or worldwide delivery, as are all orders over £30.

# Menzel pops up in Hamburg thanks to joint exhibition

**Stephen Ongpin Fine Art** is staging a pop-up exhibition from September 13-October 7 of drawings by Adolph Menzel in Hamburg after an earlier staging was cut short by Covid restrictions.

Held in association with German firm Le Claire Kunst, it comprises works from over 50 years of the German artist's career.

Menzel was a tireless draughtsman, reputedly travelling everywhere with at least one sketchbook in his pocket. By 1905, he estimated that he had filled more than 50 books with work at various stages of finish, but most signed and many dated.

Many images depict everyday life in Berlin. Pictures of beggars and labourers appear alongside portraits of family and friends. Only a few were to become full-sized paintings.

For the re-staging of the show the catalogue is being reprinted in a limited edition. It is the largest exhibition of Menzel drawings known to be held in any commercial gallery, though Germany is traditionally the strongest market for his works, according to the gallery.

Prices in the show range from around \$10,000-150,000, with one gouache priced higher.

# How did you get your start?

In 1972 I went to the exhibition Islamic Carpets from the Joseph V McMullan Collection at the Hayward Gallery and that was it: I was hooked. I plunged into learning about rugs, started buying a few, and the next thing I knew people were buying some of them from me, and here I am 50 years later still collecting and dealing in them.

# What challenges are the trade facing?

The looming recession, the cost of energy and water, and the problems of buying and selling in Europe as a result of Brexit. Economic backlash, post-Brexit and Covid have all made doing international business more difficult and more costly.

# What is one item you couldn't do without?

My Japanese root carving of a guardian figure who has been watching over me for 50 years, and some of the porcelain pottery made by my late mother, who was a celebrated and accomplished potter in South Africa.

# 4 Who do you admire?

My old pal Dr Harry Greenberg, the

Joseph D Grant professor of medicine and microbiology and immunology and associate dean of research at Stanford Medical School who is an exceptional and eclectic collector of rugs, textiles and many other things.

# **5** Real ale or espresso martini?

Neither, I don't drink alcohol and I'll stick to Fever Tree ginger beer.

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
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

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

# English embroideries impress

Massachusetts sale includes elaborate examples of early needlework from across the Atlantic

Despite the title, not everything in the Americana live auction held by Bonhams Skinner (25/20/12% buyer's premium) on August 13 was of American origin.

The content ranged further afield including pieces of Chinese export silverware and trade paintings and, from the other side of the Atlantic, a collection of early needlework.

Around 40 examples of embroidery had come from the estate of a New York antiquarian, the majority of them of English origin and dating from the 17th and early

Variously worked in colourful silks and metal threads with a variety of different biblical, mythological or secular subjects, these pieces combine skilled workmanship and strong decorative appeal and a number were pursued to levels substantially past their estimates.

#### **Busy landscape**

The most expensive was a silk needlework panel dated to the 17th century. Set in a moulded and ebonised frame measuring 171/4 x 20¼in (44 x 5lcm), it was elaborately worked with a landscape featuring a man wielding a club and various animals including a boar and dogs, lions attacking a cow and horse and two griffins, all set within a meandering floral border. It proved particularly sought after with bidding sailing to \$28,000 (£23,335), well above the \$4000-6000 guide.

Not far behind at \$27,000 (£22,500), and way past the guide of \$800-1200, was an unfinished embroidered linen panel catalogued as English c.1700 and measuring 18 x 23in (46 x 58cm). This was worked to the corners with subjects emblematic of the four continents.


Another in-demand piece was a 143/4x 13in (36 x 33cm) period framed needlework picture ascribed to England, late 17th/early 18th century, featuring a man holding a staff and a woman carrying a basket with a dog in a landscape setting which realised \$7000 (£5835) against a \$1000-1500 guide.

The same price was paid for a silk embroidered beaded and stumpwork floral panel measuring 17 x 18in (43 x











46cm) and dated to the 17th century.

maritime item relating to the early history of American yachting. Cleopatra's Barge On A voyage of Pleasure was an illustrated manuscript journal documenting the maiden voyage in 1817 of George Crowninshield's yacht. Crowninshield (1766-1817) commissioned the barge from the Salem, Massachusetts, ship builder Retire Becket in the spring of 1816

and it is thought to be the earliest pleasure yacht made in the US.

The manuscript, volume 1, bound in red Morocco, contains a narrative of the trip and 22 watercolour, pen and ink and pencil drawings of the harbours and towns around the world that Crowninshield encountered en route. It was offered together with a privately printed transcript of the journal from 1913 and Crowninshield's letter book.

Estimated at \$75,000-100,000, it sold for \$80,000 (£66,660).

# 'Gang of Five' robot takes \$70,000

A well-preserved and boxed version of the 1960s Japanese Masudaya Machine Man robot was the highest flyer in the Morphy Auctions (20% buyer's premium) August 9-10 toys and collectables sale in Denver, Pennsylvania.

The 15½in (39cm) high robot, with a gearbox displayed on its chest, is one of Masudaya's sought-after 'Gang of Five' robots and was made around 1960. These are rare to market but it is even rarer to find one that retains the original box. "This particular robot was consigned by its original owner, who found it in their attic," said Tommy Sage, head of Morphy's toy division. "It sat in a dry location, undisturbed, for over 60 years, waiting to be discovered."

It was secured by a US bidder for \$70,000 (£50,355) against a \$60,000-90,000 estimate.

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# A remarkable private collection of 80 portable watches and clocks

Collected by an enlightened watch lover, these date from the 16<sup>th</sup> to the early 20<sup>th</sup> century. "A History of Time" retraces 500 years of watchmaking history, from the first portable watches produced in the Nuremberg region to pieces from the Revolutionary period and Gondolo pocket watches made by the Geneva manufacturer Patek Philippe. One of this collector's passions was automaton and music mechanisms, as witness a very rare item: a singing bird watch case by the Frères Rochat. It comes from the former collection of King Farouk, sold in 1954 at Koubbeh Palace in Cairo at one of the five most outstanding auctions of the last century. This piece, the star of the collection, was included in the Royal Exhibition of Automata Marvels, London, in 1800, when it was part of the remarkable Berry-Hill collection.

## Fauns found at last

A rediscovered painting by the German Symbolist and Munich Secessionist artist Franz von Stuck (1863-1928) is to be offered by **Soulis Auctions** in Lone Jack, (suburban Kansas City) Missouri, on September 23.

The whereabouts of the work has been unknown since it last appeared at exhibition in Dallas in 1919 until it re-emerged last year in a Kansas City home where it is now known to have been for over 60 years.

#### Black and white existence

Von Stuck's 3ft lin x 2ft 9½in (93 x 85cm) oil on panel, titled *Lauschende Faune* (Listening Fauns), was painted in c.1899.

It was known only from black and white photographs reproduced in the *Journal Die Kunst* in 1904 and in 1909 in *The International Studio – An Illustrated Magazine of Fine and Applied Art* as part of a lengthy article titled 'The Collection of Hugo Reisinger: German and American Pictures'.

In 1909, when the artist was at the height of his career, the painting was also exhibited in the Metropolitan Museum in New York.

Remains of a label to the back of the painting from that exhibition identify it as being the property of Reisinger, a banker, businessman and prominent art collector who was a member of The Met's board of directors and married to the daughter of St Louis, Missouri, brewery baron Adolphus Busch.

Research by the Art Loss Registry tracing the painting's early years of ownership has revealed

that Reisinger acquired *Lauschende Faune* in 1899 from the Galerie Heinemann, Von Stuck's main representative.

Later that year it was exhibited at the Chicago Institute of Art and the Copley Society in Boston and its final recorded museum appearance was at the Dallas Art Association's First Annual Exhibition: Contemporary International Art.

By this time the painting had changed hands, the owner in the catalogue being shown as Edward A Faust, a St Louis restauranteur who was connected to Busch by marriage.

In 1921, Lauschende Faune was found together

with a large British equestrian work in the Kansas City home of the late Colonel and Mrs S D Slaughter.

Their grandsons, who jointly own the painting, have confirmed its existence in their grandparents' home beginning in the 1960s.

The painting comes in the original gilt frame custom-made by Hans Irlbacher of Munich and will be offered in uncleaned condition at Soulis Auctions with an estimate of \$75,000-125,000.

# Bizarre goat rider and monkey combination

Bertoia's sale of the collection of Bill and Stevie Weart will be held over two days in Vineland, New Jersey, on September 8-9. The Wearts amassed a huge collection of US and European antique toys housed in custom-built showcases in their Allentown, Pennsylvania, home.

Included among the European toys will be this 8in (20cm) tinplate clockwork toy fashioned as a monkey-training goat rider which emits a 'plink plank' sound when wound. Made by the German firm of Gunthermann, it is estimated at \$2000-4000.



## Time waits for no-one

Une histoire du temps (a history of time) is the title of the sale to be held by Aguttes in Neuilly on September 28.

It comprises a private collection of 80 watches and the portable table clocks and timekeepers that were their precursors spanning 500 years, ranging in date from the late middle ages through to the early 20th century and catalogued in chronological order.

Featured among the early pocket watches is this mid 17th century silver memento mori watch in the form of a skull with a hinged articulated jaw and suspension ring.

Watches of memento mori form (translating as 'remember you will die') became popular in the Puritan Calvinist era of the 17th century, particularly in Geneva, and they were fashionable among Puritans in Switzerland and in England. Aguttes' unsigned example, which measures 1in (2.5cm) in height and just over 1¾in (4cm) in length, has a silvered dial with roman numerals and a key wound mechanical movement with a verge escapement.

It is estimated at €6000-8000.

The 10½ in x 6¼ in (27 x 16cm) work, which bears traces of a signature or inscription lower right, has a provenance back to Léon Michel-Lévy, sold from the auction of his collection in Paris in June 1925. The guide is **€20,000-30,000**.







# Dealer establishes a new Bourne identity in Surrey

Steampunk, 1990s rave culture and a Grade II-listed 17th century former mill may at first seem odd bedfellows, but catering to both new and old collectors' tastes is what the new manager of **Bourne Mill Antiques** in Farnham is aiming for.

Also among the recent changes was the taking over of the running of the café and changing it to an 'English tearoom'.

#### Vintage to repurposed

Alongside traditional antiques and collectables the centre will introduce a vintage fashion section later this year, as well as tech-related items that have been repurposed (for example, typewriters and surveying equipment) which Symes believes will

attract those Steampunk enthusiasts (the subgenre of science-fiction mixing technology with aesthetics inspired by the Victorian age).

Other areas that Symes believes could be growing due to a younger generation of collectors who are nostalgic for their youth is 1990s rave culture memorabilia, music bands and tour T-shirts, music memorabilia and possibly video gaming.

Alongside these new interests, she says the demand for traditional antiques continues – particularly from prop buyers, but also younger buyers.

Symes explains: "There is a wealthy catchment around Farnham but we also have quite a young demographic as we are close to the Farnham campus of The University for the Creative Arts, so we see plenty of art students visit."

Symes plans to install more

room sets in the centre to "create theatre" and will also pass on advice to dealers about the latest interior design trends such as "green kitchens or velvet being popular" to help the dealers buy stock accordingly.

The building, owned by Glynn Evans who also owns The White Lion Antiques Centre in Hampshire, has had a difficult recent past. It suffered a devastating fire in 2015 which gutted the building. After extensive restoration it reopened in November 2019, only months before the pandemic lockdowns.

Symes hopes by diversifying the centre it will widen its audience and attract a larger demographic.

She adds: "Buying second hand really fits into the ethos of sustainability for younger people so we will continue to promote that."

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## **Obituary - Christopher Bangs**

Christopher Bangs, who is probably best known for his reference book on candlesticks, *The Lear Collection*, was a man of many talents.

During his teenage years he was a keen archaeologist, long before metal detecting became popular. He had uncanny abilities to understand the hidden past, and once discovered an entire abandoned flint-knapping site in a ploughed field at Peacehaven in Sussex.

As a teenager he worked at several jobs and saved money to pursue his passion to go to motor race meetings, of which he was an avid fan. He was also a keen motorcyclist.

In Chelmsford he trained as a librarian, which stood him in good stead. He was an astute editor and proofreader. However, the academic life became tedious for him. He moved to Brighton, to the polytechnic, an active and arts-minded campus.

In Christopher's spare time he and a friend set up a mobile discotheque – The Music Machine – which was very successful

During his time in Brighton he also volunteered for the Samaritans.

#### Car 'like a wedge of cheese'

His librarian's training resulted in him joining the V&A, where he worked for two years in the National Art Library.

Not a conventional soul, he insisted on working hours of his own, choosing to arrive later and leave later. He also pioneered the wearing of jeans in the museum, unacceptable until then.

Christopher was famous – or infamous – for driving a bright orange Bond Bug, a three-wheeler shaped like a wedge of cheese, which he was permitted to park within the V&A precincts.

He was on-site, fortunately, when there was a tremendous rainstorm, resulting in flooding of the library, and his alacrity helped to rescue many books and

minimise damage. that

He found time to set up a business, At the Sign of the Sad Iron, in partnership with Felicity Guille, specialising in domestic metalware. Spit-engines, downhearth goods, candlesticks and lighting were all of interest to him.

In 1974 he was poached from the V&A to become manager of the New Art Centre in Sloane Street. The prospect of life in the Civil Service dimmed in comparison with the challenges of running an enterprising venture promoting new artists. During this time he met, among many others, the artist Prunella Clough, and they became lifetime friends.

Dealing in flat irons was an interest which became very active after he had met his first wife, Rita Adam, and they moved to the Tay Valley in Perthshire. Here they bought a derelict pair of thatched stone cottages and set about renovation. Rita says that he took to this like a duck to water.

For the first bitter Scottish winter they lived in the tin-roofed bothy, sleeping with their dogs for warmth.

#### **Growing market**

Christopher still had to continue to earn his living as a dealer. He found that he could buy the relatively unknown Scottish box irons (previously often considered to be Russian), and sell them to a growing market of international collectors.

The demands of building the house and dealing in antiques meant that he would spend weeks in Scotland, then drive the 500 miles south, calling on his network of dealers on the way, and spend time in London. He loved Scotland.

Christopher was innovative and

designed his stands at antiques fairs with an artist's eye. He was one of the first to have a mobile phone – a car-phone was the only option at that time, in 1989, and eye-wateringly expensive – and he was one of the first to subject his antiques to scientific analysis. For both decisions he was mocked by many in the trade, but was proved to be ahead of the game, as no dealer now can be without a mobile and most antiques of value are subject to rigorous scientific analysis.

In 1985 the American Bud Lear was passing through London, and by chance called in at the *Chelsea Antiques Fair* in the King's Road. Here he met Christopher, who was exhibiting there, and a long-term friendship was established which resulted in the Lear Collection, and 10 years later the accompanying book.

In addition to showing at the London fairs in the 1980s and early 90s, Christopher also vetted the BADA and Olympia fairs and the now defunct *Grosvenor House Fair.* 

With the opening of his private gallery, The Triangle, in Fulham in 1996, he dropped public exhibitions and received his clients in the dramatic, spot-lit, black-painted and air-conditioned private showrooms.

In May this year Christopher died, unexpectedly, of COPD. He was 71.

We were together for 34 years. It always amused me to say: "We went out to dinner twice and have been living together ever since." We married in 2005.

I have been profoundly touched by comments made by his friends, many of whom say that there is now no-one else like him who they can ring up and chat to about life and the universe. Many have said how kind he had been to them, and many have said how much they will miss his laugh. And one of them said to me: "He was a one-off." Indeed, he was.
